



Arjan Gjonca is a Professor of Demography at London School of Economics. He holds a PhD in Economics (Demography) from LSE and continues to work in the Department of Social Policy at LSE as a full member of academic staff. Dr. Gjonça started his career as an assistant professor at University of Tirana, Faculty of Economics. His work experience includes institutions such as Max Planck Institute for Demographic Research; University of Southampton, Department of Social Statistics; University of Bocconi, Dondena Centre for Research on Social Dynamics and Public Policy (as visiting professor), and finally the Department of Social Policy at London School of Economics. His research interests and publications focus on health and mortality in developing countries. More specifically his research covers the demography of the Balkans (with particular focus on Albania); Health transition in developing and transitional Societies; Ageing in developing and transitional societies, and more recently the sex imbalances at birth and female disadvantages in health and mortality in developing countries. Past research projects focused on the importance of life style factors in health and mortality transitions for developing countries.

He is a member of different professional bodies, including International Union for the Scientific Study of Population, British Society for Population Studies (BSPS), European Association for Population Studies, Population Association of America, and many more. He has held and continues to hold honorific positions such as the Honorary Secretary of the BSPS from 2001- 2004, and a member of the council from 1997 till 2004; the vice-president of DemoBalk Association; Head of the Accreditation Council of Albania and many more.

Dr. Gjonça has acted as an adviser to different international organisations and national governments, including the World Bank, UNFPA, UNDP, Albanian Government, Turkish Government and Bosnian Government. His recent contribution to policy includes chairing the Commission on the Reform of Higher Education in Albania (2013- 2015), which has resulted in the introduction of new legislation on higher education in the country. Since 2015 to present he has held the position of Chair of the Accreditation Board (former Council) of Albania.
