GENERAL DATA FOR THE STUDY PROGRAM IN THE EXTERNAL ASSESSMENT PROCESS

The second cycle joint integrated study program “MASTER OF SCIENCE” in “ARCHITECTURE” with double degree. - JISP MSc in “Architecture”, is offered by “CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY “LADY OF GOOD COUNSEL” – UKZKM, Faculty of Applied Sciences. The faculty is organized in the below base units, which are contributing to the program:

- Department of Architecture
- Department of Architectural Sciences and Techniques
- Research Centre for Mediterranean Architecture

The program was first licenced in 2015 with the following orders of the Minister of Education and Sports:

- UMASR Nr. 247 dated 18.06.2015 (based on DAB No. 30 dated 27.03.2015).
- UMASR Nr. 335 dated 16.09.2015 for the opening of this program (based on DAB No. 30 dated 27.03.2015)

The program is organised in full time studies, with a normal duration of 5 academic years, and with a total load of 300 ECTS. This corresponds to integrated studies of 1st and 2nd cycle and to Level 7 in the Albanian Framework of Qualification.

This is the first accreditation for the program, while the institutional accreditation has been issued in 2016 and is valid until 2023.

The program is offered in collaboration with “Universita degli studi di Firenze” – UNIFI, creating the possibility for students of having a double degree if they complete two semesters in the partner university (during the 4th and 5th year)

DESCRIPTION OF THE EXTERNAL EVALUATION PROCESS

The external evaluation process is organized in fulfilment of the Law 80/2015 “On Higher Education and Scientific Research in the Higher Education Institutions in the Republic of Albania”. The procedure follows the steps foreseen in the Manual of Accreditation 2017.

In order to make possible the external evaluation process of the Second Cycle Joint Integrated Study Program “MASTER OF SCIENCE” in “ARCHITECTURE”, the procedure and regulations envisaged by the Agency for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ASCAL) have been followed:

1. Designation of External Expert for the accreditation of the Joint Integrated Study Program “MASTER OF SCIENCE” in “ARCHITECTURE” at UKZKM, on 10 September 2020, and training on the conduction of the evaluation process.
2. Order for the determination of the experts who will participate in the external evaluation, for the accreditation process of the M.Sc. Architecture program (Nr. 59 on 22/09/2020) and Contract with the experts undersigned in the same date.
3. The Technic Coordinator (TC) for the external evaluation from ASCAL: ME. Renata Qatipi
4. Following the external experts’ appointment within the Evaluation Group, a note (on 5/10/2020) was sent by ASCAL to UKZKM to set-out a two days in-site Visit.
5. The External Evaluation Group - EEG, composed by PhD. Fabio Naselli and Dr. Gjergji Islami, together with Renata Qatipi, completed the visit in the institution in 15-16 October 2020. The visit was conducted respecting the protection measures against COVID19. The EEG visit was conducted according to the below agenda:



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During the Visit, a Minute was drafted that recorded the interviews with both the academic and administrative staff of the University, as well as the students of the study program.

6. The EEG also visited the infrastructure available at the university campus and requested supplementary document to be provided by UKZKM. 15 additional documents were provided through the AMS system in response to the EEG requests.
7. On 20/10/2020 the external experts started their work by checking the newly uploaded documents, in organising the direct information taken during the Visit (from the minute), and in filling the present EXTERNAL EVALUATION REPORT.
8. The external evaluation report is based on both Albanian and EU laws and directives, on official documents submitted by the HEI, on the minute transcribed during the meetings with staff and students and on some additional documents requested during it, as uploaded in the ASCAL system after the Visit (on 17/10 and on 20/10/2020).
9. On 02/12/2020 a first draft of the report was delivered to ASCAL (ME. Renata Qatipi) to be checked in the editing and contains. The feedback was given on 07/12/2020 and its findings were beneficial to carry out the final draft of it.
10. Based on the documentation provided in the internal evaluation file for the second cycle joint integrated study program "MASTER OF SCIENCE" in "ARCHITECTURE" with double degree, in the site visit conducted, and in the supplementary documents provided by UKZKM, the EEG prepared the following final report. The report is a conclusion of the expert's assessments, based on the State Standards and Criteria on Quality Assurance in Higher Education.
11. The delivery of the final draft of the EXTERNAL EVALUATION REPORT was carried out on 13/01/2021.



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


I. STUDY PROGRAM PROVISION

Standard I.1 The Higher Education Institution provides a “Master of Science” integrated second cycle study program in accordance with its mission and objectives, aiming at maintaining national interests and values.

<p>Criterion 1 The Higher Education Institution offers a “Master of Science” integrated study program in compliance with national interests.</p>	<p>The JOINT INTEGRATED STUDY PROGRAM “MASTER OF SCIENCE” IN “ARCHITECTURE (hereinafter JISP MSc in “Architecture”) complies with national interests. As well it complies with the UKZKM statute mission (Art. 2 – Mission)¹, firstly licensed in 2004 (VKM Nr. 567, 27.08.2004) and finally accredited with VBA No. 112 dated 15.12.2017 (with the duration of 6 academic years, until 14.12.2023). The JISP MSc in “Architecture” was opened as last study program with the UKZKM Academic Senate Decision Nr. 335 on 16.09.2015, which was approved under two Orders (Nr. 247-18.06.2015, and Nr. 335-16.09.2015) from the MASR, it is offered with 300 ECTS, with a duration of 5 academic years, and it is conducted in Italian language², at the end a dual university degree is issued.</p> <p>Together with national interests, it also aims to extend its offer in compliance with that specific international interest between Albania and Italy in terms of “European proximity relationships”, as stated in the bilateral protocol between UKZKM & UNIFI³ (undersigned on 20.06.2018). <p>Criterion 2 The “Master of Science” integrated study program aims to preserve and consolidate national academic and cultural values.</p>	<p>The Joint MSc in “Architecture” is mainly aimed to exploit the European culture within the national academic and cultural values. It is indeed aimed to enforce the preservation and the consolidation of National values also stressing into consideration the ongoing process of integration within the EU-HES. UNIFI, as the lead partner, is the guarantor of this process, as stated in the attached Cooperation Agreement between UKZKM and UNIFI (undersigned on 20.06.2018)¹, and which main aim is to train professionally capable specialists who can carry on the development process of the Country within a wider horizon.</p> <p>Furthermore, the national academic and cultural values are even preserved through a number of practical activities based on a few of agreements undersigned with public institutions and focused on the safeguard of local identities, heritages, and values, which aim is to connect students with the national context and its issues.</p>



The integrated study program aims to meet the needs of the labour market and is provided in accordance with its requirements.

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Criteria	Evaluation of experts
<p>Criterion 1 The integrated second cycle study program has set well-defined objectives for student training in that program, which include in-depth scientific knowledge, skills, and professional competencies that students should acquire at the end of the study program, which characterize the profile of the program in accordance with the level of studies in which they are offered and with the requirements of the labour market.</p>	<p>The JISP MSc in “Architecture” has set well-defined objectives^{1,2} for students training in the program, which include in-depth scientific knowledge, and skills and professional competencies that students should acquire at the end of the study program. These objectives characterize the profile of the program in accordance with the level of studies the HEI is offering (second cycle) and with both the current and the innovative requirements of the Albanian and European labour market in the fields of Architecture (Architecture design, Interior design, Urban planning, Restoration, Services, and Structural design). From the data of the market analysis of the architecture sector³, conducted by the Career Orientation Office, it can be deduced that in Albania the profession of the architect is still young and in a phase of strong development. Moreover, the Albanian state is careful to include the role of the architect in the development of some of the key professional sectors, such as tourism and urban planning, through targeted development studies and programs⁴ or public assignments. <p>Criterion 2 The institution conducts studies on the local and international labour market for the study program it provides before its opening, after students' graduation, and periodically. These studies should include data from formal communication with employers of the respective field of study, their needs and requirements, student employment opportunities, data on real employment of graduates and expected developments in the relevant sector.</p>	<p>The Career Counselling Office unit at UKZKM conducted studies on the local and international labour market properly for the study program¹. The developed Report included general internal market data, as well as data from direct formal communications with employers and labour associations, involved in the field of interest, focused on their needs and requirements, and expected developments in the student employment opportunities. Being at the starting point of the curriculum, data on real employment final and periodical checks, after FAS students' graduation, are currently unavailable. The models already adopted in others of the study programs at UKZKM (a template of it was showed during the Visit) might be useful as template for the next architecture Alumni surveys. Currently, the Career Counselling Office even started in listing a few of professional firms and institutional entities potentially interested in future hiring (no evidence was provided but we were informed during the Visit) and in drafting the indicators for the future survey².</p>

	<p>CCO declared that they will try to maintain connections with Alumni in their finding of professional opportunities, as they already done for other study programs at UKZKM. The necessary experience in the architecture field is, indeed, put in place mainly through UNIFI staff mobility (considering the total number of faculty and other staff), appointed, or confirmed year by year³ in order to sustain the study program in the field of Architecture. Strengths /Affirmations

1. The general quality of the study program framework is high, it is based on the contribution of highly qualified academic staff with international experience.
2. The program gets academic and institutional support from the Department of Architecture at the UNIFI.
3. The double degree agreement enables students to be easily employed and integrated in the European market.
4. The main infrastructure in UKZKM is qualitative and fulfilling the academic requirements.
5. The small number of students enables efficient communication, coordination, and administration of the program.
6. IT system is effective, and it well supports the institution management at any levels.

Weaknesses

1. UKZKM does not provide special admission criteria for disabled students or students belonging to minorities and marginalized groups. No policies of economic aid were identified for the groups in need. (Refer to Standard V.1, Criterion 6, 8).
2. The results on quality in teaching and learning, as well as the results of the periodical quality assessments of the program, are not easily accessible and neither made public (refer to Standard III.1 and to Standard VI.5, Criterion 2).
3. The UKZKM full-time staff (in Albania) is too low compared to the total number of the academic staff. (refer to Standard I.4, Criterion 1-3, and Standard II.5, Criterion 1-5)
4. The scientific research is not enough supported, and it cannot stay merely at the individual responsibility. (refer to Standard I.6, Criterion 1-5)

Recommendations

1. It is suggested to provide a more solid support in laboratories that assist the program's activities. Possible labs could be: survey lab, model making, materials lab/library, art/drawing/photography laboratory, environmental lab, engineering lab, digital production lab etc. (refer to Standard IV.3).
2. The internal quality assurance system could further improve in the future (refer to Standard VI.1, Criterion 2), by directly involving the Department and Faculty levels and creating a follow up process/procedure (refer to Standard VI.5, Criterion 3) for all the indicators that require improvement.
3. The number of UKZKM full-time staff (in Albania) must be raised to guarantee a real reciprocity between the two partner Universities. It is recommended to amplify the Faculty of Applied Arts autonomy to avoid a failure of the study program in case of changes in the current conditions of partnership, and in the light of a more long-term sustainability of the project.

4. The internal support to the scientific research must be implemented and sustained (refer to Standard I.6, Criterion 1-5), as well as the recently created research centre must become active and its planned activity should be supported by the university every academic year.
5. The plagiarism check must be mandatory at least in the case of Master's Thesis (refer to Standard III.6, Criterion 6).
6. The transparency in all the steps of the students' complaints process must be raised (refer to Standard III.6, Criterion 8, 9).
7. The use of Italian language might limit the global development trend. It is recommended to consider the adoption of English language in the future.
8. UKZKM should plan the possibility of future enlargement to avoid leaks in case of rising number of both enrolled students and appointed new staff.
